

Message from Pastor Dean

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more important than food, and the body more important than clothes? Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life?

....But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.

Matt 6:25, 27, 34-37 NIV



Why worry? Jesus poses a very good question. Someone once said that worry is like paying interest on a loan we haven't even taken out yet. Consider "worst case scenarios". They almost never happen, and yet we worry about such things. All that interest. Stress and distress. Jesus reminds us that God takes care of birds and grass, and that we are much more valuable. And yet we worry. In this unpredictable economy, I suspect that many of us let fear control us, and so we don't give. We hold back, instead of investing in the kingdom of God.

I'm beginning to think that worry is all about trust and control. So often, we only trust what we ourselves control. But the truth is, how much of our lives do we have control over, really? It actually boils down to one thing, our choices. We get to choose how we respond to the world around us, and that is just about it. Control is an illusion.

We need to remember that few things in this life are permanent. Our possessions are not, and even death is a new beginning. I've heard that even people like JC Penney made and lost a fortune several times.

Eternity. Now there's something permanent! Maybe that's why Jesus said that we must put seeking the kingdom of God first. If we spend all our time on this impermanent stuff, we are going to miss it, and then where will we be?

But if life is not about control, then what is it about? Trust. We need to choose to trust the God of the universe to have our best interest at heart. (see Jeremiah 29:11) If God really does sweat the details, like how many hairs are on our heads, then maybe we should make it a habit of trusting him.

So, don't squander your days worrying about stuff that doesn't matter.

The reason for the changes is to offer relevant worship to those outside the church that we are not currently reaching. The purpose is to meet the needs of others, rather than focus on our own needs. The primary change that you will notice is that we are flipping the order of the worship styles we currently employ, and we are intentionally offering an hour of educational opportunities and member care between the services.

Ingathering Kits for 2010

Each year our Missions Committee selects kits to be taken to the Iowa Conference Thanksgiving Ingathering. Our congregation is invited to donate items or cash for these kits:

August – Dorm Kits – For students (all age levels) in Nigeria attending school away from home. Kit items needed are:

- 1 large bath towel & 1 washcloth
- 1 bath-sized bar of soap in wrapper
- 1 toothbrush in original package
- 1 comb 6" to 8", wide tooth or hair pick
- 2 spiral notebooks (70 sheets each)
- 6 unsharpened pencils
- 1 hand pencil sharpener

September – Birthing Kits – For mid-wives and doctors to use in Nigeria. Women in Nigeria do not go to clinics and hospitals to give birth like we have available in the U.S.

We have several of the kit items on hand. The Kit items needed are:

- 45 Plastic disposable drop cloths (each 9' x 12')
- 45 Rolls of clear flexible adhesive tape (each ¾" x 25')
- 45 Tubes antibiotic ointment (1 oz. each)

All of the Center's child care equipment was lost and their kitchen. Current estimates for repairs is at \$110,000 and insurance caps out at \$30,000. 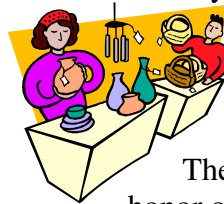
